Swine Flu Update

You have no doubt heard in the news that the potential threat of a Swine Flu pandemic in New Zealand is very serious. There are certain measures that we need to take to minimize the threat to our school community.

Talk to your children about washing hands regularly.

If your child is sick make sure they stay at home. They will be sent home if they are sick.

If you have travelled overseas do not return to school for at least four days, even if there are no symptoms of flu. This period may be extended.
