This year we have three new teachers joining our team. Ariana Williams who returns to the Far North to enrich the learning of our Nga Ringa Awhina students. Madeline Clark who will be teaching in the Active Ferns with our Year 2 and 3 students and Ryan Kiely who will be team teaching with Kohu Inch in the Taniwha Innovative Learning Environment. Welcome to our new teachers! I need to say just how impressed we have been with all our team at Mangonui School. The classrooms are beautifully set up, the learning prepared, digital formats up and going and plans in place to have a great term of learning and fun. Our mission is to ensure that every child gets the best out of their year at Mangonui School and this is certainly looking good at this early stage in the year.

Google sites are a big way that we communicate what is happening for learning in our classrooms. It is very easy to access. If you go to the Mangonui School site <u>www.mangonui.school.nz</u> and hit the **google sites tab** you will see all our classrooms. Have a look to see what is happening in your child's classroom. Most students have already started their blogs so keep an eye out.

At the beginning of every year we use National Standard achievement data from the previous year to set school goals. An area that stands out is Boys and their literacy. The data shows that we need to continue our focus on lifting their achievement in this area. The data shows that we are starting to get some shift and that our teaching is definitely having a positive impact but too many are falling short of the National Standard. All of these students will be Targeted over 2017. Teachers manage their programmes so that more teacher time is spent with these students. They may be 'front loaded' at the beginning of the day with what they will be learning in writing for that day meaning they get a double dose of the learning. We use a whole range of strategies and track their effectiveness through data. Your child may be a 'Target Student'. Teachers will be sending out information to let you know if this is the case and what we can do together to lift their achievement. All the evidence shows that when we work together we can make the biggest impact. It does not just happen at school. This does not mean you have to set up another classroom at home! It could be as simple as having more reading at home or getting your child to do some fun writing. Our teachers have some good ideas that they will share with you.

There are lots of things happening this term but one of the biggest is school camps. All our students in Term 1 have an overnight camp. The Pukeko and Nga Ringa Awhina camp at school while the rest of the classes camp away from school. It is really important that if you wish to come and stay a night on camp that you are police vetted. Forms are available at school or online <a href="http://www.police.govt.nz/advice/businesses-and-organisations/vetting/forms">http://www.police.govt.nz/advice/businesses-and-organisations/vetting/forms</a>. Please do not leave this to the last minute as they can take awhile to process. We really want as many parents and caregivers as possible to come on camp. It is an awesome way to get to know your child's teacher and other students and parents. We also have Beach Day on the 22nd of February. This is another great opportunity to meet members of the school whanau. Their will be more information sent out about these events in the near future.

We are looking at how we can communicate the 'Newsletter' better to our school whanau. A survey will be sent out asking how you would best like your Newsletter delivered, paper or electronic. We live in a world where most have access to the internet and have email accounts so it makes sense to conduct this survey. We will also be asking for you to update your email address in case there have been some changes. Every child that returns a survey will receive 5 beans for their house group!

We are really looking forward to this year. The team are really motivated and excited about their new students. If at any stage you have questions or concerns please make sure you see your child's teacher. Teachers are available most days after 3.15pm. Give Catherine a ring at the office and she can make an appointment. Have a great week.
